HELP REDUCE THE RISK OF SPREADING THE FLU, COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) AND OTHER ILLNESSES

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) reports that some people are at higher risk higher risk of getting very sick from COVID-19. These people include:

- Older adults
- People who have serious chronic medical conditions like:
 - Heart disease
 - Diabetes
 - Lung disease

While risk to average Americans remains low, common sense measures can help protect some of our most vulnerable patients. To that end, TVHS is restricting inpatient visitation at its facilities. Until further notice, visitors are not allowed in

inpatient units, including Community Living Centers and intensive care units. Requests for visitation to hospice and palliative care units will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Additional notes:

- If you become sick, stay home and call ahead to your clinic or VA facility before visiting.
- Screening for COVID-19 will be underway at entrances to TVHS facilities.
- Outpatients should come to appointments alone if possible. If not, you may bring one immediate family member or caregiver.



75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FLAG RAISING AT IWO JIMA

On Feb. 23, 1945, four days after the initial assault on the island of Iwo Jima, Marines took control of the high ground and planted a flag atop Mt. Suribachi.

The flag raising didn't signal the end of the fight on Iwo Jima. It did motivate the Marines and corpsmen still flushing out an entrenched enemy force.

Medal of Honor recipient Hershel "Woody" Williams and Navajo Code Talker Thomas H. Begay recall what it was like to see the Stars and Stripes fly high over the island.

"It was the greatest feeling I ever had," Begay said.

The island, 10 square miles in area, was a Japanese stronghold halfway between Saipan and Tokyo. The Iwo Jima assault started Feb. 19, 1945, with three Marine divisions and more than 80,000 men. Four days later, Marines took

control of Mount Suribachi and raised the American flag. Joe Rosenthal's iconic image capturing the flag raising is the model for the Marine Corps War Memorial and the National Museum of the Marine Corps.

The battle lasted 36 days, killing 5,931 Marines. Additionally, 209 Navy corpsmen and surgeons assigned to the Marines died, as well as Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen from other units. More than 110,000 Marines, Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen served, with more than 26,000 killed or wounded.

HOW DO I REQUEST COPIES OF MY MILITARY RECORDS?

https://www.archives.gov/personnel-records-center/ompf-access

Certain basic information needed to locate military service records, includes: the veteran's complete name as used in service; service number; Social Security Number (if applicable); branch of service; dates of service; date and place of birth. For records affected by the 1973 Fire, additional information, such as place of discharge; last assigned unit; and place of entry into service may be useful.

To request military service records: veterans, the next-of-kin (the un-remarried widow or widower, son, daughter, father, mother, brother or sister) or authorized representatives may: Request Records Online with eVetRecs
