## VIETNAM LEGACY VETERANS POW/MIA MEMORIAL HIGHWAY DEDICATION



A dedication Ceremony for a portion of Highway 41A today, August 14, 2019, at Patriot Park in Clarksville, Tennessee. A portion of Fort Campbell Blvd Hwy 41A, was renamed "Vietnam Legacy Veterans POW/MIA Memorial Highway. Two Signs were uncovered, one on the north bound lanes (Tiny Town Rd) and the south bound lanes at the Tennessee/Kentucky state line.

The new name is meant to honor the dedication and sacrifice of the brave men and women of Montgomery County who valiantly served their country in the U.S armed forces and gave their lives as prisoners of war in the Vietnam War.





Tennessee State Representative Jason Hodges, State Senator Bill Powers and Clarksville Mayor Joe Pitts attended the ceremony and spoke to the over 35 people, most of them veterans.

Seven members of American Legion CSM Gary W. Crisp Post 289 and two members of American Legion CSM Gary W. Crisp Auxiliary Unit 289 attended the

ceremony. Veterans plaza was filled with vendor booths with services and information for our veteran community, food services that will provide refreshments at low cost or no cost for this event and activities for those who attended.












## THANK A VETERAN AND FIRST RESPONDER EVERYDAY... NOT JUST ON HOLIDAYS

- 4. A few clicks and you're all done. When you provide your email address, you will get instant confirmation in your inbox.

And then, you'll have no cost accidental death coverage for \$1,000. In the case of an accidental death while on Legion Family business, the amount is \$5,000. (Except in Washington state in which the benefit is \$2,500 for all covered accidental deaths. You will never pay for this coverage and it is good for as long as you remain a due paying member in the Legion Family organizations.
